- While literacy, numeracy, educational and life skills are our priority, additional enrichment activities such as music, swimming and cooking are included in the programme
- Our students call uBambiswano, a place of 'hope' as they believe the programme provides them with the hope of a better future.











A LETTER FROM THE HEAD - SILVER LININGS

Dear uBambiswano family,

There was a collective groan across the nation when President Ramaphosa announced the country's move to adjusted Level 4 Lockdown on Sunday 27 June. While we were perhaps expecting it – especially here in Gauteng – another lockdown felt like a blow just as we were beginning to emerge from what has felt like never-ending social isolation.

For those of us who work with young people, we became immediately concerned. We have, of course, seen an uptick in positive COVID-19 cases in young people. Their health must be our primary concern, but we cannot forget the ripple effects on their emotional and mental well-being. We remember how hard many young people found the country's first hard lockdown and there is still some anxiety (felt by teachers and parents alike) about their academic progress.

Then, to add to the already pervasive anxiety, our country experienced a week of turmoil and violence that threatened our democracy, and certainly raised many questions about the general mood in the country. This was a stressful time for children, all of them too young to have to concern themselves with matters of violence and civil unrest, and yet old enough to have questions that urgently need answers.

The uBambiswano team certainly learned many valuable lessons in 2020 and the early part of 2021. So, when the latest lockdown and school closures were announced, we were ready! And when the civil unrest broke out, we also knew that our students needed us to step up and be calm in the storm.

Within a matter of days of the lockdown announcement, we had full packs of learning materials ready to be printed, packed and distributed to our students. Our communication networks also kicked back into gear and we revived our popular WhatsApp support groups.

Unfortunately, the Daveyton and Etwatwa communities were severely impacted by the civil unrest. Messages of hope and encouragement were shared with our community on our social media platforms and WhatsApp support groups. We also arranged a workshop for our students to help them unpack the events, where they could ask their questions and come to terms with what had happened in a safe and constructive way.

Over the past year and a half, our team has seen the need to be creative and flexible in our approach to learning and teaching. We have also seen the need to engage directly and honestly with our students on all important issues. This is part of their holistic education, and will go a long way to ensuring that they become the leaders we so desperately need.

Thank you to everyone who has supported uBambiswano, and me personally. Special mention to our donors, our sponsors, the uBambiswano committee, the directors of the St Andrew's Board and our partner schools in Daveyton and Etwatwa.

Finally, thank you to my own family for their love, support and prayers. It is because of your support that I feel able to lead this team of exceptional people, who give so much to the beneficiaries of this programme.

As Paulo Freire said; "Education is an act of love, and thus an act of courage."



In Loving Memory of Loraine Chetty


It was with great sadness that we learned of the passing of Loraine Chetty on 30 May 2021. Loraine had been struggling with a non-Covid-related illness for some time.






EYEBRAINGYM (EBG)



ROUND SQUARE 5KM HIKE

uBambiswano is proud to be part of the Round Square international community of schools. Round Square is centred on 6 IDEALS – Internationalism, Democracy, Environmentalism Stewardship, Adventure, Leadership and Service. These IDEALS underpin the Round Square Discovery Framework, which supports schools in developing and structuring holistic programmes that build character, competencies and life skills in our students. The Round Square IDEALS also provide a common platform, shared by all schools in their network, around which we can collaborate, swap and share learning resources and participate together in joint activities, such as conferences, exchanges and academic projects.

On 31 July, our students participated in 5km hike as part of Adventure and Environmentalism IDEALS. The hike was led by our Head of Outdoor Education and Round Square Coordinator **JD Mostert**. During the hike JD shared some knowledge on watershed areas and wattle as an alien invasive species. The students enjoyed the hike and the education aspect of it and reaffirmed our commitment to protecting and preserving the environment.

We would like to thank JD for his significant contribution to our outdoor education, which includes the President's Award programme for Grade 9 students, and for creating opportunities for our uBambiswano students to be fully immersed in the Round Square activities.

UNPACKING & UNDERSTANDING UNREST WORKSHOP

We were joined by a team from Umsamo Institute to help our students unpack the recent unrest and violence that took place in Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal. As a school, we felt it was important to have a debriefing with our students to help them process their feelings and anxieties caused by the recent unrest and violence. Daveyton and Etwatwa were hugely impacted by the violent unrest and most of the families in these communities had to manage some form of ripple effects.



It was beneficial for all of us to have this safe space to ask questions and raise concerns. The students were taught some useful skills that they can go back and share with their communities. The level of engagement was impressive, and the Umsamo team were very complimentary of our children's grit and resilience, and their comprehension of current affairs.
