- uBambiswano is a Saturday School programme run by St Andrew's School for Girls in Gauteng
- The programme is attended by students from schools in Daveyton and Etwatwa
- We have a 33-year track record of contributing to the lives of over 1000 students
- On average, 100 students from grades 5 to 9 attend the Saturday School over a five-year period
- While literacy, numeracy, educational and life skills are our priority, additional enrichment activities such as music, swimming and debating are included in the programme
- Our students call uBambiswano, a place of 'hope' as they believe the programme provides them with the hope of a better future.





A LETTER FROM THE HEAD - A chapter comes to an end...

Dear uBambiswano family

Four years ago, I was inducted as Head of School. I spoke of entering this new decade with energy and drive. We were gearing up to celebrate uBambiswano's 30th birthday.

I think we can all remember what happened next...

In March 2020, President Ramaphosa addressed the nation with a sobering message – both literally and figuratively. Even then, when it seemed the world had turned upside down, I doubt that any of us understood just how impactful the next few years would be and how long-lasting the effects.

That year, uBambiswano sought to keep our community close - even as we kept distant physically.

Since then, the world seems to have righted itself somewhat. But, still, there have been further challenges to be faced – both globally and locally. Throughout all of this, uBambiswano has stood firm and acted as a beacon for our community.

I have been immensely proud to be part of an organisation that nurtures connection when things seem hopeless. An organisation that never forgets its values, including those of service, education, hope and community.

As I prepare to embark on another adventure, I want to extend my gratitude to all of you who received me warmly and offered your support over the past four years. It has been challenging, but I am grateful for every lesson and every opportunity. I am more certain than ever of the value of uBambiswano as a programme and I am proud to be a part of it.

A Saturday School programme seems like such a simple idea... But, as you all know, the work that uBambiswano does is so much bigger than that.

This community truly enriches lives and allows young people to dare to hope for the bright futures they deserve.

It is easy to feel despondent when we read the news. War, messy politics, the effects of climate change, skyrocketing cost of living, desperate economic inequality... What the world needs now are creative and influential young people to set us on a new path – to teach us older folk what it means to care for our fellow humans; to live, shop, eat, and behave ethically and to achieve things that we have not yet even dreamed about.

As you know, uBambiswano's philosophy is that it is important for development to be complete and whole. It is not enough to be academically excellent. The happiest and most successful people are also resilient, kind, empathetic, active, and constantly learning.

I have been so encouraged to see the staff and students embrace this approach wholeheartedly. Every week, I am amazed at the intelligence and respect that our young students display. I have great faith in their abilities to lead us one day.

This year, we have invested time in growing relationships. Our relationship with our partner schools is getting stronger. We launched our teacher development programme, offering workshops to nominated teachers from our partner schools. These workshops have been engaging, enjoyable, and a wonderful way for us to widen the net of uBambiswano's impact.

We also launched the Principal and Deputy Principal Leadership Forum to connect school leaders in the area, fostering community and resource-sharing. Our hope is that these relationships will continue to grow and flourish, leading to better quality education overall in our catchment area.

I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude and admiration to the teachers and principals who teach, lead, encourage, and put forth the names of their brightest students every year. I am excited for the new students who will be starting their uBambiswano journeys in 2024. I know and trust that they will be in excellent hands.

Even though we are technically a Saturday school, I know that the work is never over for the teaching and administrative team. They care deeply for the students' well-being and are fully invested in helping them to achieve their goals. Thank you for everything you do for uBambiswano.

Our sponsors also make it possible for us to offer the activities we do, and to do our work. We are so grateful for, and humbled by, their belief in us and what we are doing here. In fact, we have had such strong and fervent support that we now have a healthy reserve, allowing us breathing room and confidence that we can continue to do what we do for a long while yet.

If not for the sponsors, we would likely be a purely academic programme (if we existed at all), and so we thank you for giving us the opportunity to offer the additional enrichment activities that support our philosophy of whole-student development.

This year, we have also seen an increase in parent involvement. This has been one of my favourite observations, because there is no relationship more influential in a child's life than the relationship with their primary caregivers. Your dedication to your children will directly impact their confidence, their drive, and their determination to succeed. Keep showing up for them – they appreciate it more than you know.

The students themselves have also given their all this year.

An increased number of students received scholarships to top-quality schools in the past four years, including boarding. This is so rewarding. Congratulations to you for putting in such an effort. And, to those of you that may not have made it through, your effort is not wasted. You have shown yourself that you are dedicated, driven, and worthy. Carry this spirit through with you as you complete your schooling. I have no doubts about you or your future success.

A huge congratulations, also, to our youngest uBambiswano family members – the first Grade 5 class, which started this year. Thank you for always trying your best. You have done yourself proud, and we have thoroughly enjoyed your brightness and energy on Saturday mornings.

When children are young, they rely on us grown-ups to be stable and to hold them safely so that they may stretch, try, test, experiment, fail, succeed. Brilliant teachers, a supportive school, grown ups who believe in them – these are all essential for growth. That is our aim for this programme. To be a beacon of hope. Something that past and present students can look to for guidance, light, and support.

I have been humbled to play even a small role in equipping the students of uBambiswano with the skills they need to change the world. And I truly believe that our students can. I will miss you all.

I would like to end off by thanking the people that have given me the tools I needed to get here today, and who continue to support and encourage me: my family, my friends, and colleagues – past and present – I thank you.

A special thank you to our Executive Head, Mrs Ivanka Acquisto, who retires at the end of this year, for her incredible support and superb leadership. Ivanka and her husband, Sergio, opened up their home to me and provided me with many delicious meals over the past four years. I wish them all the best for their retirement.

My time in uBambiswano has been some of the most fulfilling of my life and it has been a privilege to be part of a leadership team that has transformed the school into an example for others, of rigour and community partnership. The future is bright for the school and the Daveyton and Etwatwa communities, and I will be keeping an eye on their development with interest.

uBambiswano will always remain close to my heart. Leaving will not be easy. However, it is my firm intention to close out strongly, and there have been many opportunities to celebrate what has been a wonderful learning experience for me

Siphiwe's Farewell..A special tribute by our Executive Head Ivanka Acquisto

Siphiwe, fondly known as Mr V, leaves a lasting legacy for uBambiswano and St Andrew's. Legacy is not necessarily found in the number of years of service but in the positive impact of those years.

Siphiwe has served as Head of uBambiswano for the last 4 years with distinction.

He started at St Andrews in January 2020 where he made deep **connections** with the students, families, and staff of uBambiswano, until March 2020 when COVID descended on the world.

This was the year that learning and teaching became an online phenomenon. Mr V would not let his children from Daveyton and Etwatwa be disadvantaged. He made a plan. He and his team of staff organised for work to be dropped off and collected for marking. Moreover, the WhatsApp communication was **awesome**. Vouchers were arranged for families in need. The uBambiswano School felt nurtured and cared for. When uBambiswano returned to school all COVID protocols were carefully adhered to: masks, sanitising and social distancing.

As the new Head of uBambiswano, Siphiwe was **passionate** about the vision of whole child development. uBambiswano students experienced assemblies, yoga, public speaking, drama, and chapel services beyond the classes receiving curriculum enhancement. uBambiswano students also experienced an annual hike and sleepover as part of the President's Award and a Round Square initiative.

Mr V ensured that uBambiswano remained sustainable by getting sponsorship through his **impressive network**. He believes in relationships, and he won over many families at St Andrew's for the children and the programme. Siphiwe also networked with the principals and staff of schools in the Daveyton and Etwatwa area. As the uBambiswano programme ends at grade 9 level and then heads onto the Tomorrow Trust from grades 10 to 12. Siphiwe improved further the relationship in this partnership.

Siphiwe was so **successful** in bringing the uBambiswano parents onto our campus. They felt part of their children's progress.

He actively sourced scholarships for the uBambiswano girls and boys in the surrounding schools over and above St Andrew's – school like the Oprah Winfrey Leadership Academy, and St Dunstan's. More and more scholarships were given to uBambiswano students with the calibre of preparation they received.

To better prepare the students, Mr V, expanded uBambiswano. It now runs from grade 5 to grade 9.

Mr V encouraged, St Andrew's staff, interns, and students of St Andrew's to teach in a programme which contributed to uBambiswano being integrated into St Andrew's as the 4th school. uBambiswano became a contributor to all the St Andrew's high days like Founders Day, Open Days, the Spring Expo, 120th birthday Celebrations, etc.

Mr V also resurrected the teacher/principal development programme which has received great interest and buy in.

Siphiwe has been a **blessing** to our school in our time of need. When the socio-political upheaval of "Black Lives Matter" and its effect on our school, we asked Siphiwe to help us and lead our transformation process. Siphiwe was wise and effective as a leader. He helped us navigate the turbulent waters we found ourselves in as a school, until he eventually handed over this enormous portfolio to someone else.

Siphiwe, you will be sorely missed. Today we celebrate your incredible contribution and legacy. We thank you. You have left huge shoes to fill. Hamba Kahle! Mphephethe, Binda!


ALUMNI NEWS
