A LETTER FROM THE HEAD

Dear uBambiswano family,

In his book “Schools that Learn”, Peter Senge describes the exciting process of schools becoming true learning organisations: places where people continually expand their capacity to create the results they truly desire; where new patterns of thinking are nurtured; and where people are continuously learning together.

Almost 12 million children are delivered into the hands of South African teachers every day. Schools have a responsibility to shape young minds and provide skills and opportunities through learning. This is a privilege that must be taken seriously. I trust that our commitment and dedication to our work is evident through our students’ achievements and physical, social, emotional, spiritual (values-based), and cognitive development.

uBambiswano is also a place of healing and dignity. It is a place of learning where young people acquire essential knowledge and skills; a place of empowerment and encouragement, where young people are invited to find – and stretch – their potential; a place where both character and competence are developed. I believe that the development of a strong character cannot be separated from academic performance or excellence.

We place emphasis on the development of the whole child – in fact, the whole person, because our children will grow up and become independent. For us, there is nothing more important than providing tools and skills to our students that they can use throughout the rest of their school careers and beyond. One of these tools is a focus on a healthy body and mind. We emphasise this because we know the importance of overall well-being for a content life. In this busy life, with all of its demands on our time and energy, it can be easy to avoid prioritising our physical and mental health. We encourage students to prioritise themselves because we know that this is the key to resilience.

A powerful way of remembering to prioritise yourself is to follow the NURSE protocol:

N – nourishment
U – understanding (in other words, kindness towards yourself and others)
R – rest, relaxation, recreation
S – spirituality
E – exercise

By incorporating these into your daily life (even in the smallest ways), you will find that you are better able to handle stress and find enjoyment in being alive.

At uBambiswano we are in pursuit of developing thinking, caring, happy, young people, who understand that there is a higher purpose in life than to live for oneself. We nurture this belief in everything we do: in the way we learn, through the lessons we teach, and how we ought to meet each other with respect and dignity.

ART COMPETITION

Our uBambiswano students participated in an art competition organised by the St Andrew's Alumni Committee. There were submissions from all four St Andrew's schools, which are Preschool, Junior School, Senior School and uBambiswano. The idea behind the art competition was to get students to submit an artwork (drawing/painting/mixed media) that captures their favourite part of St Andrew's. Winners will have their artworks turned into a set of greeting cards and other memorabilia in celebration of St Andrew's 120th birthday. The alumni will then sell these cards to raise funds for bursaries. The eight uBambiswano students who made submissions of their artworks had an opportunity to visit **Hannelie Coetzee art gallery in Victoria Yards**. Hannelie uses industry waste or obsolete archives, often with unlikely partnerships, to build site-specific artworks where the meaning of the artwork is also carried in the material she uses. Her artworks are sometimes permanent, but often ephemeral.

The students also had an opportunity to visit the **David Krut workshop at Arts On Main**, where we were met by past St Andrew's Senior School Head Girl, **Britt Lawton**. On the day, the students learned about David Krut, the workshop and his projects. The printmaking team showed the students some techniques and ways that they collaborate in studio. We would like to thank the St Andrew's Alumni Committee for arranging these two visits for our students.

THE TOMORROW TRUST SATURDAY SCHOOL PROGRAMME

Congratulations to The Tomorrow Trust Saturday School Programme's 2021 matric group, who achieved a **91% pass rate** in the National Senior Certificate (NSC) Examinations.

70% of their students received Bachelor's Degree passes. All the students who came through the uBambiswano programme passed with exceptional results.

Our partnership with Tomorrow Trust on the Saturday School programme continues to be mutually beneficial. The Tomorrow Trust offers our students an extension of the Saturday School Programme from Grades 10 to 12, including a Holiday and Post-Secondary Educational Programme. The classes take place at St Andrew's every Saturday from 8h30 to 15h00. The students are provided with breakfast and a cooked lunch.

The programme provides comprehensive academic support to students in English, Mathematics, Life Science, and Physical Science. This focused support ensures that Grade 10 to 12 students pass with improved results at the end of the year.

Basetsana Seboyane: Basetsana achieved an overall average of 89% with seven distinctions in IsiZulu, English, Mathematics, Life Orientation, Accounting, Life Sciences, and Physical Sciences. She was also the top-achieving learner in the entire community of Thembisa.

Dineo Phala: Dineo achieved an overall average of 87% with five distinctions in English, Geography, Mathematics, Life Science, and Physical Science.

Lethula Moloji (uBambiswano Alumnus): Lethula achieved an overall average of 81% with two distinctions in Life Sciences, Physical Sciences.

Lungile Hadebe (uBambiswano Alumnus): Lungile achieved an overall average of 80% with three distinctions in English, Life Orientation, Religion Studies.

Patience Temba (uBambiswano Alumnus): Patience achieved an overall average of 86% with five distinctions in English, Geography, Mathematics, Life Sciences, and Physical Sciences.


WELLNESS DAY

OPPORTUNITIES FOR INVESTMENT IN EDUCATION

The programme relies on external funding, mainly in the form of fundraising by St Andrew's School for Girls and external donations. The funds are used to pay for the teaching of the students, rather than the running of the environment, and includes learning and teaching resources, teachers' salaries and stipends for volunteers, outings and camps, transport, catering and student uniforms.
