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A LETTER FROM THE HEAD

Dear uBambiswano family,

This year, I have been thinking a lot about investment. Not the financial kind, necessarily, but rather the investment of time, love, and kindness, and how this can have a profound impact on ourselves and other people. I've been thinking about this because I have seen, first-hand, how investing time, love, and kindness has the power to cause great changes. We have seen it in the planning and execution of our distance learning programme. We have seen it in our students' results. We have seen it in the transformation work that St Andrew's – our parent school – has embarked on.

As you know, uBambiswano's philosophy is that it is important for development to be complete and whole. It is not enough to be academically successful. The happiest and most successful people are also resilient, kind, empathetic, active, and constantly learning. I have been so encouraged to see the staff and students embracing this approach wholeheartedly. This year, we introduced debating, and I am amazed at the intelligence and respect that our young students display when putting forth their arguments. I have great faith in their abilities to lead one day.

We also introduced the students to yoga and swimming. Both teach important life skills. Most importantly, these activities have shown the students that there is a mind-body connection, and that movement can be relaxing, rewarding, and fun. We have invested time in growing relationships. Our relationship with our partner schools is getting stronger. This year, we visited 20 primary schools in Daveyton and Etwatwa as part of our Grade 6 intake for 2022. I am looking so forward to welcoming our new students, and extend my heartfelt gratitude and admiration to the teachers and principals who have prepared them for this new adventure.

Then, there is the investment that others have made into our programme.

Firstly, the enormous investment that the uBambiswano staff make on a daily basis. Even though we are technically a Saturday school, I know that the work is never over for my team. They care deeply for the students' well-being, and are fully invested in helping them to achieve their goals. Thank you for everything you do for uBambiswano, and for me. Our sponsors also make it possible for us to offer the activities we do, and to do our work. We are so grateful for, and humbled by, their belief in us and what we are doing here. If not for the sponsors, we would likely be a purely academic programme (if we existed at all), and so we thank you for giving us the opportunity to offer the additional enrichment activities that support our philosophy of whole-student development.

Even our wonderful students have given their all this year.

An increased number of students received scholarships to top-quality schools in 2022, including boarding. This is so rewarding. Congratulations to all of them for putting in such an effort. But, no effort is not wasted. Every one of our students has shown themselves to be dedicated, driven, and worthy. My wish is that they carry this spirit through with them as they start their new school year in 2022. I have no doubts about them or their future success.

I recently read a wonderful book by Rick Warren, called The Purpose-Driven Life. In the book, the author says this: "When you give someone your time, you are giving them a portion of your life that you'll never get back. Your time is your life. That is why the greatest gift you can give someone is your time."

And so, lastly, to the parents and guardians of these impressive children. Thank you for investing your time and your love. Every child deserves to know that they have people that love them, believe in them, and like them. Be proud of your children, but also be proud of yourselves. Your children reflect well on you, and the sacrifices that you have made to raise them to be wonderful citizens and future leaders.

PUBLIC SPEAKING AND DEBATING COURSE

The public speaking and debating course offered by the Coach Itu Academy (CIA) has been a huge success. We are already seeing a noticeable improvement in students' self-confidence and reasoning ability as a result of this course. Also, we had more students this year who were selected for various scholarship opportunities. Our students will feature in a documentary that has been put together by the CIA, which will showcase the positive impact that debating has had in disadvantaged communities.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR INVESTMENT IN EDUCATION

The programme relies on external funding, mainly in the form of fundraising by St Andrew's School for Girls and external donations. The funds are used to pay for the teaching of the students, rather than the running of the environment, and includes learning and teaching resources, teachers' salaries and stipends for volunteers, outings and camps, transport, catering and student uniforms. Donations can be given in the following forms:
